EXAMPLE ESSAY QUESTIONS

1. Choose an important Churchman of this time period (1066-1500) such as Anselm, Lanfranc, Becket or another you have studied.
 - a) Describe his life in the Church. (20)
 - b) Explain if he was successful as a leader of the Church. (10)

2. Choose a monarch of this time (1066-1500) who argued with his Church or his Barons, such as William II, Henry II, John, Henry III or another you have studied.
 - a) Describe the main events of the quarrel. (20)
 - b) Explain who was the cause of the quarrel. (10)

3. Choose a monarch of this time (1066-1500) who fought a war against another country, such as Harold II, John, Edward I, Edward III, Henry V or another you have studied.
 - a) Describe a battle from this war. (20)
 - b) Explain if this monarch was successful in his war. (10)

4. Choose a monarch of this time who invaded another country, such as Edward I, Edward II, Henry V or any other you have studied.
 - a) Describe a battle or campaign during this invasion. (20)
 - b) Explain the consequences of this battle or campaign for England and the country being invaded. (15)
